## About the Speaker

**Dr. John Battaglia, MD**, is a Clinical Adjunct Associate Professor in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health, and is Medical Director of the Program of Assertive Community Treatment in Madison, WI. After graduating magna cum laude with a BA in Psychology from Pomona College in Claremont, CA in 1980, he earned his MD with honors from Ohio State University in Columbus in 1984. Dr. Battaglia went on to serve an internship and residency in Psychiatry in the Department of Psychiatry at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, TX. He then completed fellowships with Mood Disorders Program in the Mental Health Clinical Research Center at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center and in Emergency Psychiatry at Parkland Memorial Hospital, both in Dallas.

## Dynamic Supportive Psychotherapy - 9am-4pm (Grab-and-Go Lunch 12pm-1pm)

This training will cover the underpinnings of supportive psychotherapy through the lens of ego psychology and the corrective emotional experience. Methods for building the therapeutic alliance, qualities of the therapist and therapeutic boundaries will be reviewed.

Psychotherapeutic strategies, transference, countertransference and termination will be covered. Strategies for working with special populations such as the seriously mentally ill, PTSD, and substance abuse will also be explored. Case examples with discussion will be integrated throughout the training.

## Learning Objectives - Completion of the training will allow the enrollee to:

- Apply the model of the corrective emotional experience to supportive psychotherapy
- Outline strategies for building the therapeutic alliance
- Describe qualities of the therapist that promote health, creativity and longevity in doing therapeutic work
- Describe signals of countertransference in the therapist, and methods for working with them in supportive psychotherapy
- Outline principles for healthy termination in supportive psychotherapy
